

SEEING WHAT GOD SEES

Ephesians 3:20

God never creates anything without purpose—and that includes you. Yet many believers live beneath their God-given potential, not because it isn't there, but because it isn't seen. Transformation begins when our eyes are opened to see what God sees. When we recognize divine potential, we begin to release it—within ourselves and in others.

1. SEE GOD'S POTENTIAL – Become a Dreamer

When you learn to see from God's perspective, you begin to dream beyond limitations. His thoughts are higher, His plans are greater, and His vision stretches far beyond what we naturally perceive (Jeremiah 29:11). Dreams birthed through prayer and the Word are not empty imagination—they are divine blueprints. As Joel 2:28 declares, God releases His Spirit so that His people will see visions and dream dreams. These dreams are designed to solve problems, impact lives, and expand His Kingdom.

2. SEE YOUR OWN POTENTIAL – Become an Achiever

When you recognize who you are in Christ, you step into a new identity and capacity. John 1:12 reminds us that we are now children of God, empowered to live differently. You are no longer defined by your limitations but by His strength (Philippians 4:13). God always speaks to potential, not weakness—calling Gideon a "mighty man of valour" (Judges 6:12) and appointing Jeremiah before he felt ready (Jeremiah 1:5–7). When God says "you shall," don't respond with "I can't." Shift your focus to His calling, and you will rise as an achiever.

3. SEE POTENTIAL IN OTHERS – Become a Leader

True leadership is the ability to see what others cannot yet see in themselves. Proverbs 20:5 reveals that the purposes in a person's heart are deep, but a person of understanding draws them out. Barnabas demonstrated this when he believed in Paul (Acts 9:26–27), and Jesus modelled it when He spoke Peter's future before it was visible (John 1:42). God calls us to be people who draw out destiny, speak life, and believe the best in others.

The world desperately needs **dreamers, achievers, and leaders**—those who see what God sees and act on it. This is the spirit of victory: to look for the good, believe the best, and take faith-filled risks on people.

PRAYER:

Father, open my eyes to see beyond the natural. Help me recognize the potential You have placed within me and around me. Stir up divine dreams, strengthen my faith to walk in them, and use me to call out greatness in others. Let Your power work in and through my life, that Your purposes may be fulfilled. In Jesus' name, Amen.
